Primary Librarianship Responsibilities

Faculty Services

- Promotion of Faculty Scholarship: Work with the Associate Dean for Faculty Research and the Director of Marketing and Communications to highlight faculty accomplishments in publications (internal and external), social media, and events. Conduct "Brown Bag" presentations on scholarship and digital initiatives. Assist in planning and hosting a biennial faculty scholarship reception. Generate and maintain faculty profiles on the College of Law website and SelectedWorks.
- Facilitate Faculty Research: Perpetually engaged in promoting the research interests of faculty members. These tasks include, inter alia, the following: the resolution of research requests, current awareness services, generating bibliographies, locating resources, purchasing new materials (monographs, serials, or databases) to meet research needs, accessing government documents, compiling legislative histories, evaluating publication options, evaluating the copyright concerns of publication agreements, assisting with citation in professional work, presenting to adjunct faculty on library resources, and assisting faculty members in the creation of multimedia presentations.
- Research Plans: Meet with College of Law faculty members for extended research interviews. The purpose of these interviews is two-fold: (a) to inform the faculty of the research support available from the Law Library, and (b) to gather information about the faculty members' research interests in order to craft a collection development policy that is in synch with those interests.
- Instruction: Provide instruction to faculty members on accessing and using legal databases, including: Bloomberg Law, HeinOnline, Knowledge Mosaic, Lexis Advance, and Westlaw. Instruction has been in the form of one-on-one sessions and step-by-step memoranda.

Public and Reference Services

- Reference Services: Serve on the Law Library's reference desk between eight to ten hours per week. Provide reference assistance to patrons through in-person contact, email, and the telephone. In January of 2013, the Public Service Team instituted a statistical program to monitor patron interactions. As of June 30, 2017, my efforts have resulted in 4,569 interactions, which accounts for 62.5% of the Law Library's total. Assist in reviewing, evaluating, and maintaining the Reference and Ready Reference sections of the Law Library.
- Engagement: Impact the Commonwealth of Kentucky by providing reference services to attorneys, pro se litigants, and the general public. Beyond providing data and resource materials, engagement includes bibliographic instruction and contributing to the Law Library's blog.
- Public Service Team: Presently serve as the Chairperson for the Public Service Team at the Law Library. This responsibility includes arranging for monthly meetings, generating an agenda for meetings, conducting the meeting, and then generating meeting minutes. Work with in the team requires the drafting of policies that reflect best practices, including a policy on legal reference versus legal advice.

UKnowledge

- Coordinate Efforts: Serve as the point person for the College of Law's digital commons efforts. Develop new initiatives for the College of Law's collection of digital scholarship. Attend meetings with other UKnowledge collection managers on the University of Kentucky campus. Devised a digital commons collection strategy.
- Populate Digital Collections: Secure the copyright permission from publishers for faculty scholarship. Embed faculty scholarship with metadata and then upload that scholarship to UKnowledge. Coordinate with other law librarians to generate and populate digital collections.
- Faculty Involvement: Generate and maintain SelectedWorks profiles for all faculty members. Educate the faculty in one-on-one conferences on the benefits of digital scholarship. Develop new initiatives for the College of Law's collection of digital scholarship. Attend meetings with other UKnowledge collection managers on the University of Kentucky campus.

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Instructional Services

• Legal Research: Teach two sections of Legal Research to first year law students. Design and implement an appropriate, engaging, and challenging curriculum. Generate topical pre-class, in-class, and post-class activities that ensure comprehension, engage different learning styles, and encourage collaboration. At the end of each semester, I am evaluated on numerous criteria by my students. I receive scores on a scale of I through 5, with 5 being the highest evaluation. During my employment at the College of Law, I have received the following average evaluation scores:

- Specialized Legal Research: Teach a specialized research course entitled Federal Administrative and Tax Research (Law 900-001). Design and implement an appropriate, engaging, and challenging curriculum. Generate topical pre-class, in-class, and post-class activities that ensure comprehension, engage different learning styles, and encourage collaboration.
- Upper-Level Legal Research Instruction: Prepare and teach one-time bibliographic instruction sessions to upper-level law school courses. Assist students in these courses by generating LibGuide pages to describe library resources, and scheduling one-on-one appointments to review paper topic generation, how to use treatises, and which databases are relevant.
- Clerkship/Associate Research Insights Bootcamp (C.R.I.B): From 2013 to the present, each May, I help team teach a one-day legal research "boot camp". The goal is to prepare our students for the research tasks that they might expect in their summer internships.

- Source and Cite: Assist students affiliated with the Kentucky Law Journal and the Kentucky Journal of Equine, Agriculture, & Natural Resources Law with locating and citing resources.
- *UKnowledge:* Facilitate the archivization of both journals in UKnowledge.

Admission of Students

- Matriculated 149 students into the College of Law, Class of 2016. This represented an increase of 8.7% from the previous year.
- The Class of 2016 has a median LSAT score of 157 and a median GPA of 3.50. These scores represented a one point drop in the median LSAT score, when our benchmark competitors were seeing a two to four point drop, and a .01 drop in the median GPA.
- The Class of 2016 included 8.7% minority students.
- Served as a point-person on admissions during the ABA site visit in 2013.
- Became proficient in using and maintaining the ACES2 database for admissions.
- During the admissions cycle, I was responsible for preparing and running weekly meetings with the Admissions Committee.

Recruiting

- In Fall 2015, I traveled throughout the Commonwealth and the country to engage prospective students. Facilitated the travel of numerous College of Law faculty members and administrators to attend recruiting events.
- The number of applications for the University of Kentucky College of Law increased in the 2015-2016 cycle by 6%.
- Assisted in recruiting high school students to apply for the UK BLUE program, which is a 3+3 program to receive a B.A. and J.D. in six years.

Event Planning

- Planned, coordinated, and served as the Master of Ceremonies for three Open House events. The November 2012 and 2015 Open Houses were directed at prospective candidates. The March 2013 Open House was for students that had been admitted to the College of Law.
- Planned and executed the IL Student Orientation in August of 2013. This included the management of approximately 80 volunteers.
